#### Obituary:

We regret to inform members that former President Mr. T. W. Ventress died earlier this year. Mr. Ventress had been a member of the Society since 1937 and our President since 1973. He will be best remembered for his White (Transparent) Gooseberry of 1952. It set a new show record for Champion Berry that was to remain unbroken until 1982, and which still holds the record for the heaviest white shown at Egton Bridge.

**WORLD RECORD:** for an individual berry was a Yellow Woodpecker equivalent to 33 drams 2 grains shown by A. Dingle at Marton - 1978.

**BEST OF THE SEASON:** The Cheshire Shows do tend to produce slightly heavier berries - perhaps reflecting a more favourable environment for gooseberries!! However, Egton Bridge does occasionally produce the heaviest berry of the Season. B. Harland (1985) and R. Bennison (1982) being the most recent to hold such an honour. This year (1989) the Cheshire Shows take the honour with a (Yellow) Montrose Gooseberry (shown at Marton Show by A. Dingle) tipping the scales at an equivalent of 31 drams 17 grains.

----- R U L E S -----

1. That this Society be called "THE EGTON BRIDGE OLD GOOSEBERRY SOCIETY," and that subscribers of one pound be members thereof.
2. That the affairs of the Society shall be conducted by a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer and Committee. Five to form a quorum. In the absence of the Chairman, the Committee at any meeting have the power to choose an Acting Chairman for the meeting. All officers to be members of the Committee.
3. That the Annual Meeting be held on Easter Tuesday each year, when all entries must be paid the week following from that date, or cannot compete.
4. The election of officers to take place at the Annual Meeting.
5. The Secretary shall have power to call a meeting at any time. Notice to be given to each member.
6. The Committee shall have power to fill up any vacancy that may occur in their body, and to make such bye-laws as from time to time may be deemed expedient.
7. All Gooseberries to be the bona-fide growth of the members showing.
8. All Gooseberries to be handed to the weighman perfectly sound and dry. Twin berries to be distinctly twins, i.e., two on one stem naturally. A pair of twin berries cannot be split in any case.
9. That the heaviest berry, irrespective of colour, take the premium prize; if a maiden grower, the maiden prize also, and so in succession with the next heaviest in every colour.
10. That no member be allowed to take more than one prize in the four colours, but can compete in twin, heaviest twelve or heaviest six sections of the Show.
11. That a prize be given for the second and third best berry in the four colours.
12. That a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize be given for the twelve heaviest berries. No previous winning berries allowed to compete.
13. That a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize be given for six heaviest berries. No previous winners allowed to compete.
14. That a prize be given for berries of four colours. Any member winning a prize cannot compete, and all winning berries are ineligible.
15. That two persons be chosen to see that the Gooseberries are properly weighed and prizes awarded accordingly.
16. No person becoming a member will be allowed to compete with berries from trees that have belonged to other members, unless they have been removed in the presence of one or more of the Committee.

17. That in the event of the death of a Member of the Society, one member of deceased's family may exhibit from the said member's trees, but cannot compete for the Maiden Prize if this has already been won by the deceased member, without the said trees being lifted in the presence of two members of the Committee.
18. That all members who fail to pay their contributions must stay out of the Show "two years" before being allowed to exhibit.
19. In the event of any dispute arising, it will be decided by the Committee, their decisions to be accepted as final.
20. That the Show take place on the first Tuesday in August at Egton Bridge. All berries to be in to weigh not later than 1.30 p.m. or not allowed to compete. All berries to remain on the table till 7.30 p.m.

ALLOCATION OF PRIZES

Prizes (except Champion Grower) are allocated purely on weight. New members are classed as Maidens and are promoted to the Open Category only after taking First in the Maiden section, or a First in the Colours section.

1. Champion Berry:

Open and Maiden growers eligible. Heaviest berry in the Show - this berry will also take First in its respective colour and if shown, by a Maiden; would also take Maiden First.

2. 1st/2nd/3rd in Red/Green/White/Yellow:

(Colours Section) Open and Maiden growers eligible. 1st/2nd/3rd places required for each of the four colours of gooseberry. A member is only allowed one prize in this section, taken by his heaviest winning berry (regardless of prize status). A Maiden taking a First is promoted to the Open Class. A Maiden berry winning here could also take a prize in the Maiden section.

3. Maiden Section:

Maiden growers only. 1st/2nd/3rd places required, regardless of colour of berry. The Maiden taking First is promoted to the Open Class.

4. Best Beaten Berry. (1st only):

Heaviest berry shown by an Open or Maiden grower who has not won a prize in any previous section.

5. Twin Berries:

Open and Maiden growers eligible. 1st/2nd/3rd places required.

6. Maiden Twins:

Maiden growers only. 1st/2nd/3rd places required. (Maiden twins can win in both section 5 and 6).

7. Heaviest Twelve:

Open and Maiden growers eligible. No berry that has won in any of the above sections is eligible. If the member is present he should select his own twelve, otherwise a Judge or Steward will select on his behalf. A member (with sufficient berries) should enter this section before he enters the next. 1st/2nd/3rd places required.

8. Heaviest Six:

1st/2nd/3rd places required. Open and Maiden growers eligible. No berry that has won in any previous section is eligible.

9. Maiden Six:

1st only. Maiden growers only. No berry that has won in any previous section (except Heaviest Six) is eligible.

10. Four Colours:

Only members (Open and Maiden) who have not won any prize in any previous section are eligible. Must have entered one berry in each of the four colours at the time berries were submitted.

11. Champion Grower:

Berries entered in each colour section (red, yellow, green, white), in twins and heaviest twelve are ranked according to weight. The first ten in each section score from 10 points down to one point. Points scored by the exhibitors (Open or Maiden) in all six sections are totalled - first prize (only) going to highest scoring exhibitor. Whether or not any berries scoring points in this section have won (or been barred from) prizes elsewhere is irrelevant as this prize is for the Grower, rather than the berry.

12. In the event of recorded weights indicating a tie for a prize, then those berries will be brought back to the scales and be balanced one against the other. The heavier berry takes the prize if such balancing shows weights are not exactly matched. If, however, berries are exactly matched, then both berries will be considered joint winners of that prize!

Will members please note: The Committee is to recommend to the A.G.M. that Rule 20 be amended in 1990, in that, 'all berries to be in to weigh not later than 1.00 p.m. or not allowed to compete.' Exhibitors at the 1990 Show are, therefore, advised to ensure their entries reach the Showroom before 1.00 p.m.

Mr. B. Harland is our first Champion Grower, with a total of 46 points from a possible maximum 60 points.

NEW FOR 1989

The continued increase in the number of exhibitors and the generosity of Mr. W. Graham, have led to the introduction of a new prize category this year.

Mr. Graham had previously won the Harland Challenge Cup (for champion berry) for three consecutive years (1977/78/79). Under the old rules, he therefore kept the Harland Cup. In 1980 he donated a new W. Graham Challenge Cup for the Champion Berry section. However, in 1987 Mr. Graham indicated he wished to return the Harland Challenge Cup to the Society and this trophy is now back in use for the Champion Berry.

This allowed the Society to introduce a new category, that of Champion Grower, for which the W. Graham Challenge Cup would be the trophy.

In the Champion Grower section, we attempt to identify the grower who has had the best season overall. Individual berries entered in each of the Colours Section (Red, Yellow, Green and White) are placed in rank order within their colour section. The heaviest berry in each of these colours scores 10 points and so on down the order to the tenth heaviest berry in each colour, which scores one point. The same process is applied to entries in the twins and the heaviest twelve. We thus identify the most successful grower by totalling the points scored in those six areas of the Show.

This is the first time we have used a points scoring system to allocate prizes, though the Cheshire Shows have done so for some time. Points are scored on the basis of rank order alone and whether the berries have won (or been barred from taking) prizes elsewhere in the Show is irrelevant in this new section, as it is the grower, rather than any individual berry category that is being judged!! A maximum of 60 points is possible!!

Under today's rules, all our trophies are held for 12 months only and can never be won outright.

GONE SINCE 1889

The results of our predecessors in 1889 make interesting reading.

The Champion Berry (from G. Barker) was a Red London (23 drams 19 grains), one of two of that variety in the Show. Bobby was the most popular red, with eight examples shown, whilst one each of Lord Derby, Blucher and Companion made up the other red entries.

In the Yellow berries, Levellers were the most popular with eight examples. There were also four Ringers, two Mount Pleasants and two High Sheriffs (including J. Harrison's heaviest yellow at 21 drams 23 grains).

In the Green berries of one hundred years ago, all seem strangers today. Four were Stockwells, two were Shiners and two Plunders, with one Diadem, and the heaviest green, a Bravo (or Green Bobby) from W. Breckon at 21 drams 7 grains.

In the White Section Careless accounted for three entries, two were Fascinations, another two were Antagonists (including heaviest White from Mrs. Bennison at 21 drams 1 grain). One each of Faithful, Transparent, Precilla and Hero of the Hill completed the White Section.

In the twins (won by W. Stanforth with a 33 dram 3 grain pair of Stockwells) another variety (Red-Clayton) is added to the list of gooseberries now rarely, if ever seen.

Where are they now, those once successful berries??
